Purpose

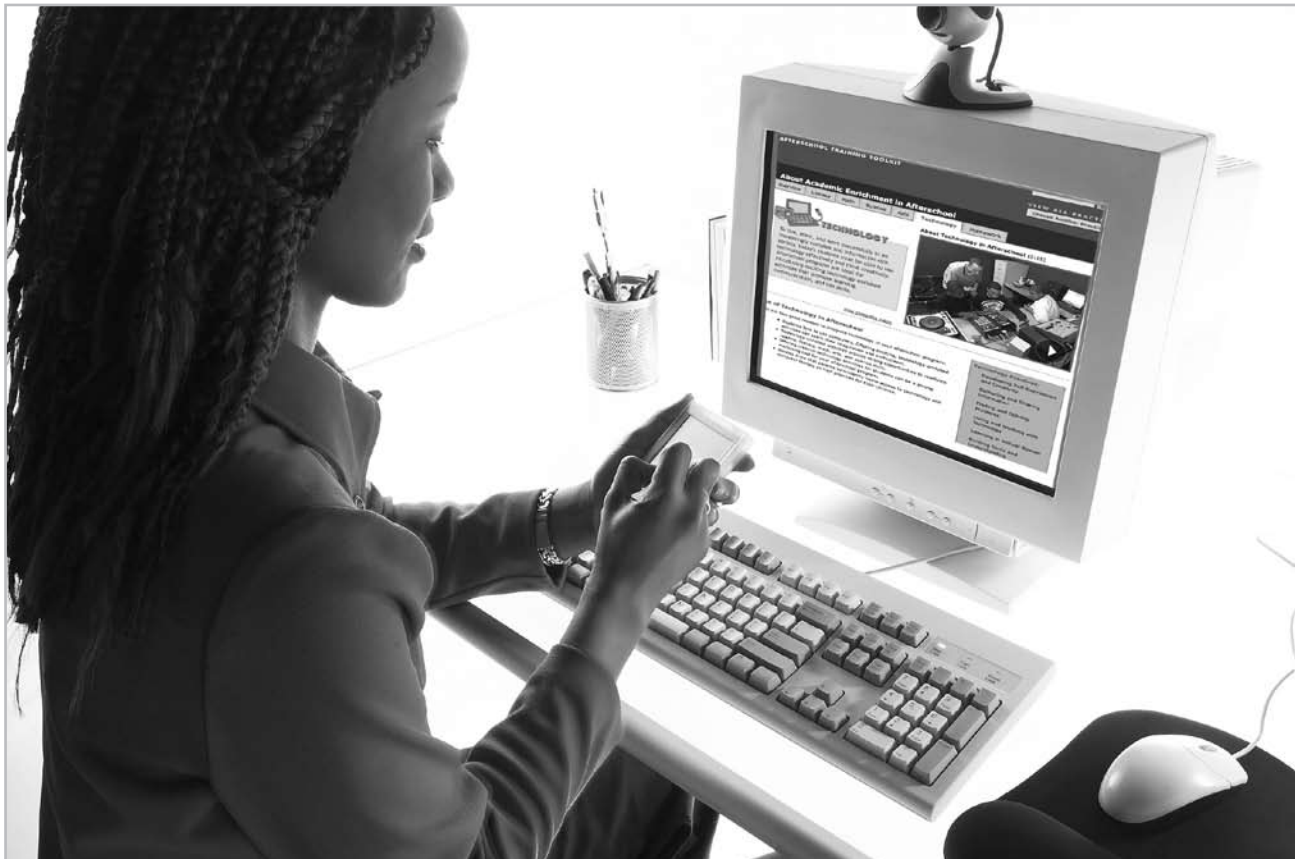
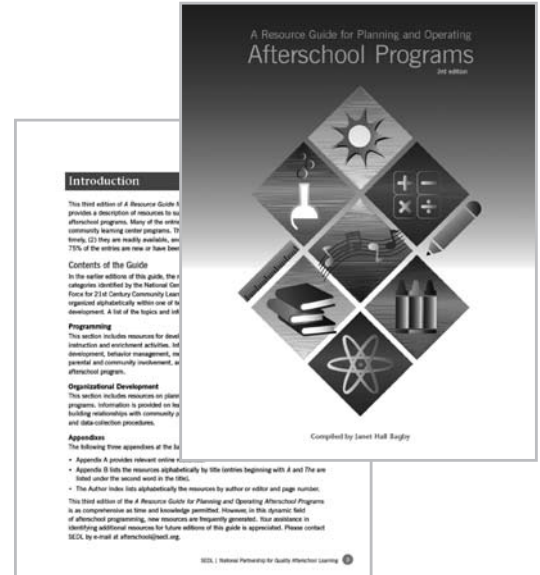
